

Ecology Update

ALTON DRIVE POND RETROFIT (Lake Asher)

The Alton Drive Project will redirect the flow of stormwater runoff to an existing wet detention pond for more efficient treatment. The project will treat, settle and decrease harmful sources of pollutants such as nutrients from fertilizers prior to flowing into Lake Asher for 13.55 acres of watershed of the subdivision to the west, Lynwood Ave. & Curtis Dr. to Martex Dr.

This project by Seminole County will begin construction in January 2020

BLPA ECOLOGY FOCUS GROUPS FORMED

All eyes on the watershed! A clean watershed makes for cleaner lakes!

On August 22, 2019, thirty concerned residents met for a roundtable introduction with a mission to discuss the issues with each lake (Asher, Bear, Little Bear and Cub Lakes), to form active focus groups on each lake, exchange current emails, cell phone numbers, re-group and update residents on current and future problems affecting the Lakes.

We are in need of active "LAKE WATCHERS" to watch and report what they see, so that we can better catch problems damaging the lakes, when or before they occur.

Bill Houston gave his review of the Bear Lakes history and what BLPA has done to preserve the Bear Lakes.

We discussed the lakes' Hydrology and reviewed subarea drainage maps for each lake.

We can focus and become active "watchdogs" for the watershed drains, ditches and the County projects from the Hydrologic/Nutrient Budgets & Management Study and Current Plans.

A discussion of what will work and where we see problems is key to preserving the lakes. Informative meetings and individual Lake Focus Groups are bringing the residents together through the BLPA.

Stormwater Pipe Reinforcement/Repair 9/26/19







Collapsed pipes were causing road depressions and blockage on Bear Lake Circle. Seminole County reinforced the stormwater pipes under the road late September 2019 with fiberglass sleeves. The pipes were cleaned and fiberglass material inserted into pipe, cooked from 120 to 180 degrees, sealing and reshaping the collapsed pipes. This system is used as an emergency bypass between Bear Lake and Little Bear Lake. Did you know there once was a canal between the two lakes?

Note:*Rain data in this chart reflects the rain amounts collected during the time period from the last month's LAKEWATCH data collection date to the next month's data collection date, and not for the month itself. The elevations are recorded on the actual date of the LAKEWATCH

What Happened to Bear Lake's Water Quality? (Brown not Green!)

The clarity of Bear Lake dropped from 10' to 7' in one month when the heavy rains began flushing in the muddy waters of Lake Asher. After the restoration of Lake Asher, when islands of muck and vegetation were removed, mud continues to flush into the pipe from Lake Asher to Bear Lake with rains and general overflow of Lake Asher. Although the pipe was cleaned by the Seminole County Stormwater staff after the restoration and a pipe replacement, dirty water continues to flow into Bear Lake with heavy flushes of rains, as occurred in June, July and August.

LAKEWATCH Coordinator for Bear Lake, Nancy Dunn,

contacted the County, provided photos of the muddy water entering Bear Lake, and requested a turbidity barrier. Bob Ballerino, Team Leader with Seminole County Roads and Stormwater, responded fast with an inspection of the pipe, vaccon flushing truck, cleaning the pipes to Bear Lake and placing the turbidity barrier to catch and settle any future muddy water and debris from entering Bear Lake.

This damage to Bear Lake may take a long time to recover, as the muck stirred up in Lake Asher is a fine silt which mixed easily into the clear waters of Bear Lake.





BLPA Welcomes New LAKEWATCH Volunteer

The newly restored "Scenic Lake Asher" once again has a volunteer to collect monthly samples for nitrogen, phosphorous, algae and water clarity. Reports of any changes to Lake Asher will now be recorded for analysis by many agencies, including DEP, Seminole County and Florida LAKEWATCH.



CHANGE YOUR LAKE FROM GREEN TO CLEAN Watch Your Lawn Service Company!



Ithough the Bear Lake Preservation Association (BLPA) strongly recommends NO FERTILIZER, it is important for us to report on the key highlights of the Fertilizer Ordinance in our area that began in October 2017. If you use a lawn care professional, know the checklist provided by Seminole County below:

How we maintain our yards has a big impact on our surrounding environment. Excessive water use, improper fertilization, or blowing grass clippings/leaves down the storm inlets/drains can degrade our waterways. A knowledgeable and well-trained lawn care professional will manage your yard through a series of "best management practices" that benefit you and the environment. Does your lawn care professional have the proper training and certification? Use this checklist to better know your lawn care professional, your yard, and your role in the environment!

ARE THEY QUALIFIED?
DO THEY KNOW YOUR YARD?

DO THEY FOLLOW THE SEMINOLE COUNTY FERTILIZER ORDINANCE?

HOW DO THEY CLEAN UP? Make sure lawn care professionals do not leave grass clippings, fallen leaves, or other debris on streets, sidewalks, or other impervious surfaces. They should blow them back onto the lawn or bag them.
